Public disclosure on liquidity risk

The Reserve Bank of India (“RBI”) has issued guidelines on Liquidity Risk Management Framework for Non-Banking Financial Companies and Core Investment Companies on November 04, 2019 vide circular RBI/2019-20/88 DOR.NBFC (PD) CC. No.102/03.10.001/2019-20. As per the said guidelines, NBFCs are required to publicly disclose the below information related to liquidity risk on a quarterly basis. Accordingly, the disclosure on liquidity risk as at 30th September 2023 is as under:
